RIG: Consists of the mast, sails and ropes which form a shape to capture the wind.

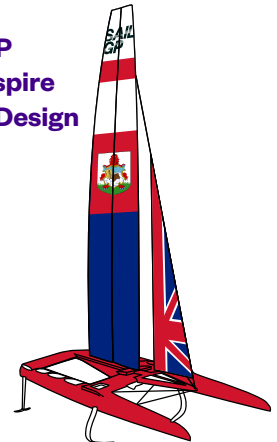

FUN FACTS

Bermuda Cedar is an incredibly strong resilient form of wood but also incredibly lightweight which allowed most early designs to be singularly planked instead of the traditionally double planked vessels.

Did you know?

Bermudians refer to traveling up and down the island in reference to the average wind direction. So, if traveling from Somerset to St. Georges you would normally be going with the wind - **"down the country"**.

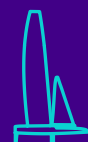
