WHAT IS SAILGP?

The most exciting racing on water, the Rolex SailGP Championship features national teams battling it out in identical high-tech, high-speed 50-foot foiling catamarans at iconic venues around the world.

Racing faster than the wind at speeds in excess of 100 km/h (60 mph), SailGP is driven by the sport's top athletes, with national pride, personal glory, and a total prize purse of US\$12.8 million at stake. SailGP is where sport meets spectacle. It's close-to-shore stadium racing, with world-class, water's edge excitement, and an Après-Sail atmosphere like no other.



F50 CATAMARAN

The F50 wingsailed catamaran is a revolutionary concept in sail racing, the culmination of 10 years of development in high-performance, foiling, multihull racing. It was created as a one-design class to provide each of SailGP's 13 national teams with identical cutting-edge technology, putting the race results directly upon the skill of the global championship's world-class athletes.

The F50 shares its DNA with the revolutionary catamarans used for the 35th America's Cup in 2017, but it has evolved considerably since. Powered by a modular wingsail with three sizes and flying above the water on hydrofoils, the F50 marks a huge step forward in the evolution of the sport. The ROCKWOOL Racing Team led by Nicolai Sehested holds the current F50 speed record of 103.85 km/hour, set at the German Sail Grand Prix, Sassnitz in Season 5.

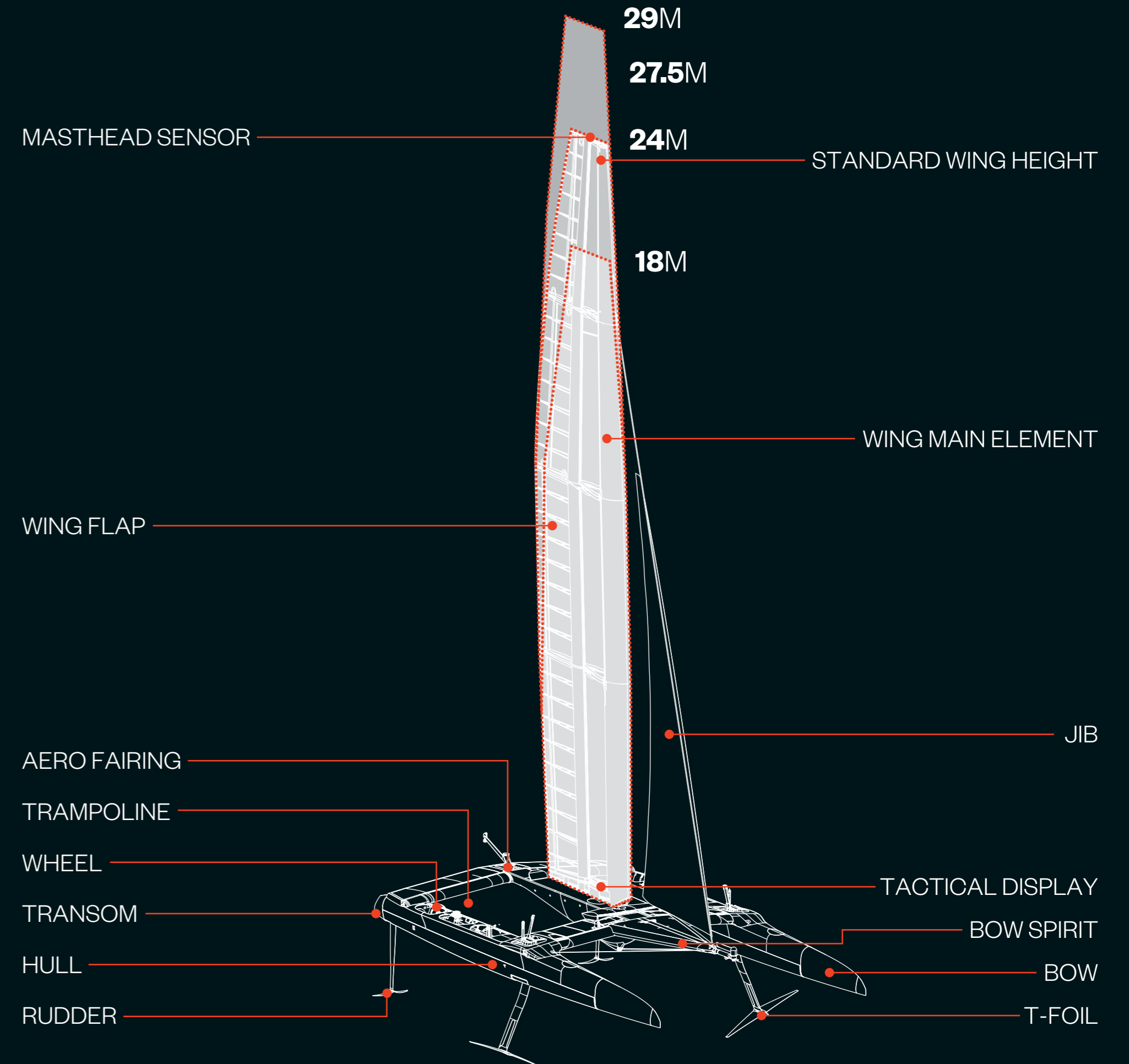

TERMINOLOGY

AFT

Towards the rear of the boat.

BOUNDARY

The edge of the official race course. Sailing across the boundary will result in a penalty.

BOW

Front of the hulls.

CAMBER

The asymmetry between the two acting surfaces of an aerofoil which determines the amount of lift produced.

CAPSIZE

When a boat is turned over on its side or upside down.

CATAMARAN

A boat that has two parallel hulls of equal size which gives a boat more stability.

DIALING DOWN

Dialing down usually happens when two boats come together on the race course – the idea is to force the opponent downwind, driving them away from where they want to be.

DIALING UP

Dialing up is mostly a starting tactic. One boat forces their competitor uncomfortably far up wind, which de-powers the boat and leaves them at a disadvantage.

FLEET RACING

All teams compete on the same race course at the same time.

FLY TIME

The amount of time a boat spends foiling, with 100 percent being the holy grail around the race course. If this is achieved, the boat's hull never touches the water.

FOILS

Right angled carbon fiber daggerboard which lifts the boat out of the water as speed builds, reducing drag of the hulls and helping the boat to achieve high speeds.

HULL

The main body of the boat, joined by cross-beams and a 'trampoline' platform.

HUNTING

When two boats are converging, but instead of holding course the starboard tack boat changes course directly towards the port tack boat forcing them to take action to avoid collision. This aggressive tactic is predominantly a match racing strategy.

JIBE

A maneuver to change course when a boat is sailing away from the wind (downwind). A boat turns its stern through the wind so that the wind direction changes from one side of the boat to the other.

LAYLINE

The angle required in order for the boat to successfully reach and go around a course mark.

ONE AND IN

Refers to the fact that a boat only has to make one more maneuver (tack/jibe) in order to make the next mark.

PITCH POLE

When a boat capsizes stern over bow. It is usually the result of being extremely overpowered.

PRESSURE

Areas on the race course where there is more wind.

PRE-START

A crucial part of the race where boats use the racing rules and tactics to jockey for position and attempt to win the start, giving them an immediate advantage in the race.

RUDDER

Used to steer the boat. The F50 rudders have T-foils that raise the back end of the boat. This ensures that the boat flies parallel to the water's surface, increasing stability.

SAILING HIGHER

Heading farther up towards the wind direction so shortening the distance between the boat and the mark.

SPEED BUILD

When a boat sails more off the wind than it should in order to build speed. Something that is critical to make sure the boat gets up on the foils.

TACK

A maneuver to change course. As a sailing boat can't proceed directly into the wind, the bow of the boat is turned through the wind so that the wind changes from one side of the boat to the other. A boat on port tack (where the wind is blowing from the left hand side of the boat) must avoid a boat on starboard tack.

TRANSOM

The rear of the hulls.

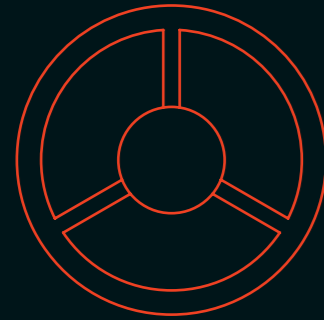
WINGWASH

The boat that is sailing closer to the wind creates a shadow over the other boats, disturbing the quality of the wind and slowing the other boats down.

WINGSAIL

A rigid, aerodynamic structure similar to an aircraft wing, fixed vertically to the boat to provide thrust.

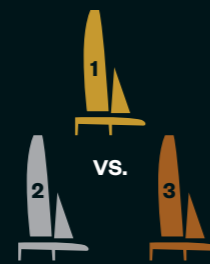

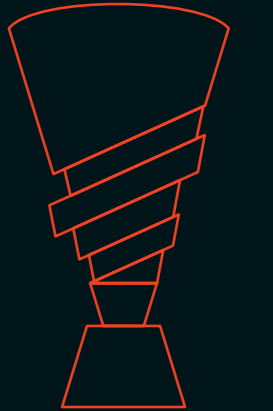

The BONDS Flying Roos SailGP Team has established one of the most remarkable records in high-performance sailing. Founded in 2019 for the inaugural season of SailGP, the team has been led by driver & CEO Tom Slingsby, whose illustrious career includes Olympic gold and six world championships in the Laser class, as well as the America's Cup win in 2013 with Oracle Team USA.

Australia struck immediately, claiming the first SailGP title in 2019, and continued its dominance with the Season 2 championship and a third consecutive title in Season 3. In subsequent seasons, the team maintained its presence at the front of the fleet with podium finishes in Seasons 4 and 5 Grand Finals, solidifying its reputation as the SailGP's most consistent and successful crew.

Beyond Slingsby, the team features key athletes including flight-controller Jason Waterhouse and grinder Sam Newton, all contributing to the team's technical precision and competitive edge. The squad has also embraced gender diversity and talent development, with strategists Natasha Bryant and Nina Curtis shaping the next generation of elite sailors.

Off the water, the Australia SailGP Team combines performance with strong branding and commercial innovation. Recently rebranded as the "BONDS Flying Roos" under a major Australian apparel sponsorship, the team also welcomed Hollywood stars and entrepreneurs Hugh Jackman and Ryan Reynolds as co-owners, enhancing its global profile and appeal. Anchored in Australian sailing heritage and propelled by Slingsby's leadership, the team continues to set the benchmark for excellence, consistency, and ambition on the SailGP circuit.

BRA

The Mubadala Brazil SailGP Team brings the vibrant spirit of Brazilian sailing to the global racing stage. As the league's first South American crew, the team blends Brazil's passion, innovation and teamwork with world-class expertise. Led by two-time Olympic champion Martine Grael, the first female driver in the league, the team is breaking barriers and inspiring a new generation.

Founded ahead of 2025 Season under the backing of Mubadala, the team made its debut with intent and ambition. In its first season, Brazil achieved its first fleet-race wins in New York and Cadiz and claimed top honours in the Impact League's "Race to Zero Waste" challenge, partnering with local communities in Guanabara Bay to remove over 4,000 kg of marine debris.

Under Grael's leadership, the team fields an international and Brazilian-rooted crew, executing a performance-first race programme while staying purpose-driven. The result: in a short span the team has made measurable gains both on the water and in its social-impact mission.

The NorthStar SailGP Team represents a bold convergence of elite sailing, national ambition, and global vision. Since joining the league in Season 3 (2022) under driver Phil Robertson, and securing its first event win in Christchurch, New Zealand, the team has steadily climbed the ranks to emerge as a serious contender. Driven by entrepreneurial energy, a commitment to wellbeing through sport, and a mission to create opportunities for the next generation, NorthStar embodies both performance and purpose.

Entering Season 5 with a refreshed identity and new ownership, the team continued to push boundaries on and off the water. A central part of its rebrand was the appointment of two-time Olympic champion Giles Scott as driver. Bringing a wealth of experience from his Olympic triumphs and America's Cup campaigns with Great Britain, Scott leads a strong lineup of Canadian and international talent. Under his helm, NorthStar delivered a standout victory at the 2025 Rolex Los Angeles Sail Grand Prix, outperforming league powerhouses New Zealand and Australia.

Beyond racing, NorthStar is making a meaningful impact in the community. The team claimed top honors in the 2025 Impact League's "Climate Action" category, partnering with youth and environmental programs to drive measurable change. From the Canadian waters to competing on the global stage, NorthStar blends world-class athleticism with a purposeful mission, poised to become a defining force in SailGP.

The ROCKWOOL Racing SailGP Team represents Denmark on the global stage, combining Scandinavian precision, speed, and purpose. Since joining the league in Season 2 (2020) under the backing of ROCKWOOL, the team has steadily climbed the SailGP ranks. Known for its disciplined approach and relentless drive, Denmark has established itself as one of the fleet's most dynamic contenders.

Led by driver Nicolai Sehested, the team features Olympic champions, record-breakers, and ocean racers united by their pursuit of excellence. A record-breaking speed merchant, Sehested became the fastest driver in sailing history when he clocked 103.93 km/h in the F50 in Sassnitz in Season 5. Smashing records is nothing new for the Dane who previously helped set the 24-hour speed record during The Ocean Race in 2018.





Beyond sailing, ROCKWOOL Racing leads by example. The team won the Season 3 Impact League, recognised for its sustainability initiatives such as "More Speed, Less Plastic" and its work with the One Ocean Foundation. After a challenging 2025 season, the team is determined to come back stronger in 2026, racing for a cleaner and faster future.

FRA

The DS Automobiles SailGP Team France is one of the original teams in the SailGP league, the French crew has consistently ranked among the top performers. Operated by K-Challenge, France's leading sports-technology company dedicated to high-performance sailing, the team is led by visionaries Stéphan Kandler and Bruno Dubois, and supported by prestigious partners including ALL Accor, L'Oréal Groupe, Leyton, and K-Way. Since the 2025 season, the team has also welcomed the backing of football superstar Kylian Mbappé, whose "Inspired by KM" foundation harnesses the power of sport to motivate and empower young people.

At the wheel, Quentin Delapierre has redefined the team's competitive edge. Taking over from Billy Besson in late 2021, Delapierre has built a reputation for aggressive starts and precision in extreme conditions - hallmarks of "Les Bleus". Under his leadership, the team claimed its first event win at the 2022 Spain Sail Grand Prix in Cádiz, and set a league speed record of 99.94 km/h in Saint-Tropez during Season 3, a benchmark that stood for nearly two years. In 2025, France delivered a dramatic comeback victory at the inaugural Germany Sail Grand Prix in Sassnitz, overcoming heavy damage and Delapierre's injury during the practice race.

Beyond the water, the DS Automobiles SailGP Team France champions diversity, supports the development of female athletes, and fuses world-class sporting performance with meaningful social impact.

GBR

The Emirates Great Britain SailGP Team was a formidable force both on and off the water in the 2025 Season, becoming the first ever team to complete the treble – winning the Season Championship, SailGP's environmental and social-focused Impact League and topping the season leaderboard on points.

Emirates GBR is led by the most successful Olympic sailor of all-time, Sir Ben Ainslie, as CEO. The team's F50 is driven by Olympic gold medallist, former Moth World Champion and America's Cup Helm, Dylan Fletcher MBE. The crew alongside him features sailing's top talent, including Olympic gold medallists Hannah Mills OBE, Stuart Bithell MBE and Ellie Aldridge MBE, as well as America's Cup athletes Neil Hunter, Nick Hutton, Luke Parkinson and Ben Cornish. Kai Hockley, a 20-year-old from Tottenham, London, completes the squad as a development sailor who is part of the team's Athena Pathway programme.

GER

The Germany SailGP Team, presented by Deutsche Bank, has rapidly established itself as a high-tech, purpose-driven contender in SailGP. Launched in May 2023 by co-owners, entrepreneur Thomas Riedel and four-time Formula 1 World Champion Sebastian Vettel, the team combines elite sport, advanced technology, and a strong commitment to sustainability. In late 2023, it entered an official partnership with Deutsche Bank, aligning the team's sporting ambitions with the bank's "blue economy" and ocean-resilience agenda. Together with its owners and partners, the German team is dedicated to innovation, performance, and long-term environmental responsibility as it forges a path toward SailGP's upper echelons.

At the wheel of the German F50 is Erik Heil, a double Olympic bronze medallist whose 49er class career features European and World Championship titles and Olympic podiums in Rio 2016 and Tokyo 2020. Under his leadership, the team has shown remarkable progress, and in Season 2025 secured its first fleet race win in front of a home crowd at the inaugural Germany Sail Grand Prix in Sassnitz. The team followed that with its SailGP event victory at the Rolex Switzerland Sail Grand Prix in Geneva, overcoming established rivals in challenging light-wind conditions.

Beyond its accomplished driver, the German crew features a strong national and international line-up, including strategist Anna Barth and grinders Jonathan Knottnerus-Meyer and Felix van den Hövel - a blend of youth, experience, and technical excellence driving the team's continued rise on the global stage.

The Red Bull Italy SailGP Team represents a bold new chapter in high-performance sailing – fast, fearless, and future-focused. Having made its debut in the 2025 SailGP season, the team brings together Italy's finest sailing talent with world-class expertise to redefine the sport's competitive edge. Led on the water by SailGP veteran Phil Robertson and guided by sailing legend Jimmy Spithill as CEO and co-owner, the team combines elite athleticism with visionary leadership. Under the ownership of Assia Grazioli Venier, Gian Luca Passi de Preposulo and Anne Hathaway, Red Bull Italy blends entrepreneurial innovation with global ambition, positioning itself as a powerhouse on the international stage.

Officially launched in November 2024 as the 12th nation to join SailGP, the team debuted at the Emirates Dubai Sail Grand Prix and quickly established itself among the sport's elite. In May 2025, it transitioned into a private team under the female-led consortium Muse Sport, led by Grazioli Venier, further underscoring its progressive spirit. By September 2025, the team captured its first victory at the ROCKWOOL France Sail Grand Prix in Saint-Tropez, a landmark achievement for Italian sailing. The talented crew includes Tita, strategist Maelle Frascari, and a lineup of Olympic and world champions dedicated to pushing the boundaries of speed, skill, and strategy on the water.

Finishing XX in the 2025 Season Championship, the team looked to become even more competitive and the new season

The Black Foils represent the best of New Zealand sailing - a team built to fly higher and leave an unmistakable mark. Helmed by legendary duo Peter Burling (driver & co-CEO) and Blair Tuke (wingtrimmer & co-CEO), the crew combines Olympic pedigree, America's Cup mastery, and a relentless drive for innovation and purpose.

Established in Season 2 (2020), the team adopted the "Black Foils" identity in March 2024, a nod to New Zealand's sporting colours and the foils that lift the F50 catamaran beyond the water. Their journey has been one of grit and growth: after a challenging debut, they claimed the inaugural Impact League title with purpose partner Live Ocean Foundation, then in Season 3 qualified for the Grand Final (finished 2nd), before elevating their performance in Season 4 to dominate the regular rounds and challenge fiercely in the Grand Final (finished 3rd). The 2025 campaign has already seen wins in Dubai and Portsmouth alongside other top-tier performances with a third place finish in the Abu Dhabi 2025 Season Grand Final.

Burling, a prodigy turned world-class skipper, boasts youth world titles, six 49er world championships with Tuke, Olympic gold and silver, three consecutive America's Cup victories, and numerous SailGP event wins. He and Tuke co-lead team strategy and operations, while strategist Liv Mackay, recruited in 2019, adds tactical expertise honed through Olympic and foiling racing, and has become central to the team's success.

The Black Foils are not here to blend in, they are here to stand out. With laser focus on speed, teamwork, and ocean stewardship, they embody New Zealand's spirit of adventure, racing for the future and championing bold action for generations to come.

The Los Gallos Spain SailGP Team have written a remarkable story of resurgence and ambition on the global racing circuit. The team began in Season 2 with driver Phil Robertson but struggled in Season 3, finishing last on the championship leaderboard. The decision was made to replace Robertson first with Jordi Chamar and later with Diego Botín. The reset paid off quickly - with Botín as driver and Florian Tittel as wing-trimmer, the team surged to claim the Season 4 championship in San Francisco, becoming the youngest crew in SailGP history to win a season title.

Botín, born in Madrid and raised in Santander, began sailing at age seven and developed a passion for boat design, hydro-aerodynamics, and psychology alongside competitive racing. By age of 30, he had competed in three Olympics and captured gold in the 49er class at Paris 2024, alongside Tittel, who earned his first Olympic gold in the same campaign. Their leadership anchors a talented crew, including grinders Joan Cardona and Bernardo Freitas, strategist Nicole van der Velden and flight-controller Joel Rodríguez.

Los Gallos' story is one of skill, teamwork, and relentless ambition, aimed squarely at the top of the world stage. On and off the water, the team combines elite performance with innovation, inspiring the next generation of foiling sailors and demonstrating what happens when a young crew punches above its weight.

Artemis Racing, Sweden's internationally acclaimed sailing team, proudly confirmed its return – entering the Rolex SailGP Championship's 2026 Season as the Artemis SailGP Team. Under the experienced leadership of CEO, Olympic gold medallist Iain Percy, and backed by Torbjörn Törnqvist, Artemis will bring Sweden's rich sailing heritage and competitive spirit to SailGP. Their world-class line-up includes driver Nathan Outteridge, back in SailGP having previously driven for Japan and held various on-water and on-shore interim roles with other teams.



SUI

Explora Journeys Swiss SailGP Team is carving out a distinct identity in the global racing arena, combining Swiss precision, innovation, and sporting ambition. Rooted in the youth-development GC33 platform Team Tilt, the team was officially launched in 2021 and entered the SailGP championship at the start of Season 3.

Under the leadership of driver Sébastien Schneider, a three-time Olympian from Geneva, the Swiss crew has steadily improved its performance. After a challenging debut, the team refreshed its mindset and roster for Season 5, adding experienced and talented athletes including Arnaud Psarofaghis, Matt Gotrel, and Stewart Dodson. This renewed approach and energy paid off, culminating in strong performances with third-place finishes at the Emirates Great Britain Sail Grand Prix in Portsmouth and at the team's home event, the inaugural Rolex Switzerland Sail Grand Prix on Lake Geneva, showcasing both sporting and national ambition. At the 2025 Germany Sail Grand Prix in Sassnitz, the team also joined the "100 km/h club," winning a fleet race during one of the season's fastest and most extreme weekends.

Beyond on-water success, the Switzerland SailGP Team is recognized for its commitment to sustainability and innovation, collaborating with aviation pioneer H55 to transfer knowledge from electric propulsion and clean technologies into high-performance sailing. Underpinned by Swiss values of precision, teamwork, and forward-thinking, the team is steadily climbing the ranks, racing not only for results but for a future where sport and technology intersect to inspire and lead.

The U.S. SailGP Team has navigated a dynamic journey from its 2019 launch in the inaugural SailGP season – initially featuring experienced sailors but faced ebbs and flows, prompting a transformation in Season 2 under the legendary Jimmy Spithill. The squad performed steadily and despite not winning a single event, finished third in the Grand Final. The real breakthrough came in Season 3 with the team’s first-ever event victory at the Range Rover France Sail Grand Prix in Saint-Tropez backed up immediately by another win at the Spain Sail Grand Prix in Cádiz, marking a turning point in the team’s competitive trajectory.

A major transformation came in November 2023 (Season 3) when technology investor and Uber co-founder Ryan McKillen, two-time world champion sailor Mike Buckley, and a diverse group of sports, media and entertainment figures, including Issa Rae and NFL stars DeAndre Hopkins and Roquan Smith, acquired the team in the largest SailGP team transaction to date. In April 2024, alpine skier and entrepreneur Lindsey Vonn joined the Board of Directors, reinforcing the team’s ambition to expand appeal and athlete development.

The team boasts a strong all-American roster, including Olympic bronze medallist Hans Henken, America’s Cup talents Michael Menninger and Andrew Campbell, and driver Taylor Canfield, a seven-time match-racing world champion who took the helm following the acquisition. This is also the only team in the championship with a female athlete in the grinding position.

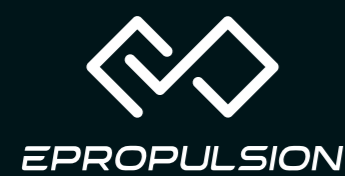
